Gov. Beshear Makes Appointments to Boards and Commissions

FRANKFORT, Ky. (Oct. 3, 2014) – Governor Steve Beshear has made the following appointments to Kentucky boards and commissions:

Gov. Beshear has appointed John M. Shulhafer to the Kentucky Board of Architects to serve for a term expiring Sept. 19, 2018.

- John M. Shulhafer, of Louisville, is an architect at Studio Kremer Architects. The appointment replaces Jill L. Smith, whose term has expired.

Gov. Beshear has reappointed Timothy A. Murphy to the board to serve for a term expiring Sept. 19, 2018.

- Timothy A. Murphy, of Nicholasville, is an architect at Murphy Graves Trimble PLLC.

Gov. Beshear has appointed Jane Driskell to the Capital Planning Advisory Board to serve for the remainder of the unexpired term ending Oct. 30, 2017.
