C. KEEC's Niche

1. Focus areas for statewide organizations: Council members made a list of focus areas for each statewide organization. G. Garner would like updates on how the KERP is being implemented because, to him, it is the core of what we should be doing. B. Hardin asked whether KEEC could have a series of meetings with superintendents and principals. G. Garner sees a KEEC

role in ensuring EE is part of pre-service teacher education. M. Norton suggested being the eyes and ears for the legislature to monitor the progress of EE in Kentucky.

D. Communicating and Marketing the Council's Story

1. Annual Report: Council Members suggested an annual report to the legislature that is very concise, a ½-page with only four items. This would be separate from a resource guide for educators. It would focus only on what we need from the legislature and be presented outside of the legislative session. K. Ceralde suggested it should include anecdotes as well as numbers; perhaps a student who is using this in a new job. B. Hardin suggested involvement in the Green Schools Coalition, which may be duplicative of the Kentucky Environmental Literacy Alliance.
2. Priorities: The Council made a list of priorities to address which will be a framework for reporting to the council on agency activities.
