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Complete a Kentucky Green and Healthy Schools project at your school using the new, simplified form that aligns with NGSS

Teachers, we hope you will work on a KGHS project this year. We have made some changes that should make it easier:

• Inventories are no longer required. Instead, students will complete their own investigation with no set questions to answer.

• If you need help prompting the student investigation, all of the old inventory questions are available in a teacher guide for each category along with resources and project ideas. You can find the teacher guides at greenschools.ky.gov/Pages/Program-Overview.aspx.

• You no longer need approval for your project. You can just fill out the project form once and turn it in when you are finished.

• The new format supports the Kentucky academic standards for science (NGSS).

Submit your letter of intent for US Green Ribbon Schools recognition by October 15

Kentucky public K-12 schools are once again invited to apply for U.S. Department of Education Green Ribbon Schools recognition. This award honors schools that are exemplary in the three pillars of reducing environmental impact and cost; improving the health and wellness of students and staff; and providing effective environmental and sustainability education, which incorporates STEM, civic skills and green career pathways.

Participation in Kentucky's Green Ribbon Schools Program is a three-step process:

• By October 15, 2015, complete and submit a "Letter of Intent" to KDE to indicate your school's desire to submit an application.

• By December 1, 2015, complete and submit the KY 2015 GRS application to KDE to demonstrate your school's progress towards the goals of each of the three GRS Pillars.

• By January 22, 2016, KDE will work with schools to submit a nomination package to the US Department of Education.

Certified Professional Environmental Educators – Attend the renewal webinar on December 9, submit CE Reports by January 30

Certified Professional Environmental Educators, this is a reminder to save the date for this year's Renewal Course on December 9th at 11:00 p.m. The course will be a webinar that you can attend live from your computer, or watch as a recording later. We moved it a little earlier this year based on feedback that you would like to use it as a forum for help with your Continuing Education Reports, which will be due again on January 30.

We made some changes to the renewal forms:

- We added a few questions to the Annual Continuing Education Report Form in order to help with grant applications;
- We updated the Self-Assessment to reduce the number of categories to rate; and
- We no longer require you to turn in the Self-Assessment.

If your certification has lapsed, get certified again through the new Reinstatement Course

If you graduated from the Professional Environmental Educator Certification course, but missed the deadline for renewing your certification in 2014 or 2015, you may now apply for reinstatement of your certification. KEEC is rolling out a Reinstatement Course that was developed with input from our Certification Advisory Committee. The goal is to engage our highly qualified community of graduates in contributing to the needs in the field of environmental education. In addition to completing your regular renewal requirements, you will spend 20 hours working on evaluating and EE program or implementing Kentucky's 5-year EE master plan. The application is available under the "Lapsed Certification" heading at keec.ky.gov/EECertification/Pages/CER.aspx.

We will pilot this reinstatement process in 2015 and 2016, during which time all graduates of the Professional Environmental Educator Certification course are eligible for reinstatement, and the Reinstatement Course fee is \$25. In 2017 and beyond, only graduates whose certification has been lapsed for 3 years or fewer will be eligible for reinstatement, and the Reinstatement Course fee will be \$25 for those whose certification has been lapsed for one year, \$50 for two years, and \$75 for three years.
