2018-2019 Service Snapshots

NUMBER OF HOURS SERVED: 13,314.5 VALUE: \$285,196.59

By early May, EELCorps members served over 13,000 hours. Kentucky's "Value of Volunteer Time" is \$21.42 per hour, making the value of service member's time worth over \$285,000!





EELCorps members create and lead EE activities and programs that last 20 minutes or more to increase environmental literacy across Kentucky. The EELCorps goal overall is 8,000 people reached.
